

Professional Inspector and Public Member Vacancies on Texas Real Estate Inspector Committee

The Texas Real Estate Commission invites applications for appointment to three open positions on the Inspector Committee.

The advisory committee's purpose is to make recommendations to the Commission regarding a variety of inspection-related matters toward the goal of ensuring a high degree of service to and protection of the public in dealing with inspectors. The committee consists of six professional inspectors and three public members, with one public member seat and two professional inspector seats open. Each term will be for six years, expiring on February 1, 2017.

Inspector applicants must hold a current active license as a Professional Real Estate Inspector in Texas. Following the Commission's model, the public members cannot hold occupational licenses in the real estate field (appraiser, real estate broker/salesperson, mortgage broker, etc.); however, a municipal development planner, construction or safety code enforcement official, commercial banker or CPA would be permitted.

The committee is permitted to meet by teleconference, although it is anticipated that some travel to Austin may be necessary. Limited funds may be available for travel reimbursement, but due to legislative restrictions, the Commission is not able to compensate members for their time. All committee meetings must comply with the Open Meetings Act.
