Commission Fills Vacancies on Texas Real Estate Inspector Committee

The Texas Real Estate Commission elected three new members to the Texas Real Estate Inspector Committee and reappointed one member at its meeting on February 26, 2001. The committee is composed of nine professional inspectors licensed for a minimum of five years, each of whom is appointed for a six-year term and no more than three of whom may hold a real estate license. This statutorily established committee recommends to the Texas Real Estate Commission possible changes in rules and procedures relating to the licensing and regulation of real estate inspectors.

Elected to six year terms expiring on January 31, 2007 were Shavauna Morgenroth-Hardin, John L. Cahill, and T. J. Rowles while Allan MacGillivray was reappointed to complete an unexpired term ending on January 31, 2003.

Shavauna Morgenroth-Hardin is owner of Precise Home Inspections, The Woodlands, and has been active in the Texas Association of Real Estate Inspectors (TAREI) and the Texas Association of Builders for several years. She is a graduate of Sam Houston State University and has worked in various facets of the residential real estate business.

John L. Cahill is President of Cahill Inspection Services of Plano and has been licensed as a home inspector since 1986. He has taught home inspection and structural pest courses in several states. He is an active member of TAREI and the American Society of Home Inspectors.

T. J. Rowles of Brownsville brings to the committee several years experience as a home builder and served as President of the Cameron County Builders Association. For six years he was a member of the City of Brownsville Building and Standards Committee. Licensed as an inspector since 1987, he is the owner of The House Detective in Brownsville.

Returning for another two years on the committee is Allan MacGillivray of Del Rio. Licensed since 1985, McGillivray is owner of Amistad Inspection Service and a past president of TAREI. He has served on the Inspector Committee since 1995.
